## **NLC Grant Overview**

In March 2025, the National League of Cities (NLC) issued a request for proposals, inviting cities nationwide to apply for the Advancing Economic Mobility Rapid Grant program. Applicants were encouraged to concentrate on three key strategy areas, highlighting the unique and impactful roles that cities can play in fostering economic mobility for their communities:

- 1. Creating quality employment opportunities for residents.
- 2. Equitable support to strengthen or start small businesses.
- 3. Helping residents connect with services or public benefits.

## Scope of Work-World Cup Prep for SMBs

KC BizCare will use the rapid grant funds grant to develop industry-specific regulatory checklists and host public education sessions with small businesses, Entrepreneur Support Organizations (ESOs), and other city departments to help them navigate city permitting and compliance requirements.

- Our proposed project will develop and distribute detailed business checklists and deliver educational programming focused on city regulatory processes.
- These materials and events will be tailored to industries most likely to benefit from World Cup activity: mobile food vendors, short-term rental operators, sidewalk cafés, block party/event hosts, and pop-up retailers.
- "Lunch and Learn" sessions with Entrepreneur Support Organizations (ESOs) to train them on new tools, checklist, and to gather insights.
- **Public input sessions for small business owners** to learn what the city is doing to help small businesses and for participants to provide feedback.
- Workshops co-led by city departments, offer business owners an opportunity for regulatory assistance and include professional services.
