











of raw sewage from an antiquated septic system, prompted the decision to close the station in September of 2019. During the last year of its operation, this station responded to a combined total of 5,275 Medical and Fire calls.

Fire Station 40 reopened in December of 2021. Brown and Root provided general contracting and oversight for the renovation. The renovations included:

new plumbing including connection to the city sewer system

gender neutral bunk rooms and lavatories

new electrical system, HVAC system, appliances, and furniture

new roof

renovated kitchen/day room

additional quarters to centrally locate a field EMS Assistant Division Chief in the Northland

The newly remodeled station meets current city code along with other fire station design standards and houses a pumper, ambulance, and Assistant Division Chief. The total cost of renovation for KCFD Fire Station 40 was approximately 1.3 million. \$900,000 came from PIAC funds from Districts 1, 2 and 4 with the remaining portion coming from capital generated from the fire sales tax.

The new station houses a pumper and ambulance as it did in the past. The renovation has allowed for KCFD to add an EMS Operations Chief. The EMS Chief will assist in responding to emergency calls within the Northland.
