MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE DISTRICT

MARCH 18, 2021

Time and Place

An annual meeting of the Board of Directors (the "Directors" or "Board") of the Kansas City Convention Center Headquarters Hotel Community Improvement District (the "District") was held on March 18, 2021, commencing at 2:00 p.m. at Polsinelli PC, 900 W. 48th Place, Suite 900, Kansas City, Missouri 64112 and/or by telephone conference, after giving due notice.

Attendees; Call to Order

The following Directors were present: Russ Edwards, Mark Ching, Thomas Turner, and Lance Tryon (Director Joel Smith was absent). Also present were Roxsen Koch, Patrick Swain and Amy Grant of Polsinelli, PC along with Kelly McCabe, Director of Finance for Loews Hotels & Co. After recognizing that a quorum of the Board was present, Thomas Turner called the meeting to order.

Resolution 2021-1

Thomas Turner explained that a copy of the meeting minutes were provided in the packet. There being no discussion, Mark Ching made a motion to adopt Resolution 2021-1, approving the minutes of the December 7, 2020 board meeting. Lance Tryon seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

Resolution 2021-2

Thomas Turner stated that resolution reflects Mark Ching serving as Treasurer, Lance Tryon serving as Secretary, and Thomas Turner serving as Chair. There be no discussion, Mark Ching made a motion to adopt Resolution 2021-2, appointing officers of the district. Lance Tryon seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

Resolution 2021-3

Thomas Turner explained that a copy of the proposed budget was included in the packet. Kelly McCabe stated that she needed a few minutes to review the budget prior to its adoption. Thomas Turner tabled the motion until the end of the meeting.

Resolution 2021-4

Thomas Turner briefly explained the resolution. There be no discussion, Mark Ching made a motion to adopt Resolution 2021-4, authorizing preparation and submittal of FYE 4/30/2021 Annual Report to the City Clerk and Department of Economic Development. Lance Tryon seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

Resolution 2021-5

Thomas Turner briefly explained the resolution. There be no discussion, Mark Ching made a motion to adopt Resolution 2021-5, authorizing preparation and submittal of FYE 4/30/2021 Annual Report to the State Auditor. Lance Tryon seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

Resolution 2021-3

Kelly McCabe and Roxsen Koch had a brief discussion regarding how the CID can utilize the non-captured economic activity taxes. Roxsen Koch suggested that Kelly McCabe submit copies of invoices and other documents that the Developer is seeking reimbursement for further review and discussion and that the Board could define parameters of how future requests for reimbursement should be handled.

Kelly McCabe and Roxsen Koch also discussed that the Reimbursement Agreement states that CID Annual Administrative Costs shall not exceed \$30,000 per year, subject to incurring an extraordinary costs such as Extraordinary Collection Costs. The Reimbursement Agreement also states that the District shall utilize CID Revenues to create a Reserve Fund to pay annual CID Annual Administrative Costs. Kelly McCabe indicated that \$15,000 would be an acceptable Reserve Fund amount to handle annual administrative costs. Mark Ching made a motion to set the Reserve Fund amount at \$15,000 per year. Lance Tryon seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved by the Board.

With that, Mark Ching made a motion to approve Resolution 2021-3, approving a budget for FYE 4/30/2022. Lance Tryon seconded the motion and it was adopted unanimously.

There being no other business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.

The life of the District is for an initial term of fifty (50) years following the effective date of the Ordinance establishing the District, after which, the District shall be automatically continued for successive ten (10) year terms in perpetuity.
