Executive Summary

Increasing the user fee for events at Convention and Entertainment Facilities. Beginning May 1, 2023-24 Fiscal Year.

Discussion

The City currently assesses a user fee of \$2.00 on ticket sales for events held at the Convention Center, Bartle Hall, Municipal Auditorium Arena, Music Hall, Little Theatre, Conference Center, Grand Ballroom, and American Royal Complex. This fee is used to pay first the principal and interest on bonds and then maintenace, repair and the future modifications to these facilities. The increase to \$3.00 will be used to support operation costs in the the Department of Convention and Entertainment Facilities.

The user fee has not been increased since May 1, 2010. In FY 2023-24 the \$3.00 user fee will generate an additional estimated user fee revenue in the amount of \$281,143.
