I have been host to 100's of visitors to Kansas City - making them feel welcome & providing advice on restaurants, things to do & places to visit. I am registered & have paid taxes to the city & state for my guests. SO MANY of these guests are so grateful and appreciative of a home to come back to each night after conducting their business, visiting with friends & family, or taking in the sites & exploring Kansas City.

I feel the voices of these Kansas City residents & visitors express the need for STR's in Kansas City way better than I can. Here are some comments from some reviews:

- "It was more than comfortable for a quick, one night trip to KC for an event at Uptown Theatre. So much more pleasant and comfortable than a hotel and the process could not have been easier"
- "The absolute perfect place for our 2022 Thanksgiving. We loved being able to bring our dogs as well!"
- "My little French bulldog and I were in KC for about 3 weeks for work and this could not have been a more comfortable stay. KC had quite a cold front of weather so we took advantage of the coziness of the space every night"
- "This property has everything you need for your home away from home. The location is great, safe neighborhood near Westport, The Plaza, Warwick Theatre, Museum, Arts and much more!"
- "Jaymi was very kind and very easy to get a hold of. No issues whatsoever. A perfect stay close to all the big neighborhoods you want to visit in KC!"
- "This was my second ~3 week stay at Jaymi's, and it felt like coming home. Her place is so charming and comfortable with all the amenities I needed to cook a lot and relax with my son in the space. These guests don't want to stay in hotels. They want to enjoy a home. They want to experience what it's like to be a local - to feel like an insider, not an outsider. There are plenty of visitors who DO want a hotel experience - so that's what they choose.

99% of my guests are respectful guests who want to visit our city. I am a **responsible host** & don't allow parties. I have policies & systems in place which keep the rare booking from bringing 'extra guests' which could lead to a party or disturb neighbors. I am up-front with my guests that I have exterior cameras for safety reasons.

I understand the concerns of residents in some neighborhoods. The answer is not a complete ban. The answer is creating policies which create **responsible owners**. The answer is **LOCAL OWNERSHIP**. I'm guessing that most of the properties which have had issues also have an absentee owner. I live here. I can stay in tune with my space & my guests & even

drop by when needed. The other answer is making sure all properties are **registered & paying taxes!**

Please do not penalize our entire city & it's visitors because of a few. Thank you all for what you do & for caring for our city, its people and its visitors. Since my corporate job was eliminated last year (after 12 years), this is my livelihood. Please don't take it away.
