Executive Summary

Authorizing the acceptance of a \$936,171.27 grant from the United States Department of Homeland Security AFG program, and including a City match of \$93,617.13, or ten percent of the Federal contribution bringing the total cost of Federal and Non-federal funding to \$1,029,788.40; estimating revenue in the amount of \$93,617.13 in the General Grants Fund; appropriating \$936,171.27 to the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) account in the General Grants Fund; designating requisitioning authority; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Discussion

This Grant will assist the Fire Department in the purchase of 28 thermal imaging cameras with an increased screen size, along with real time digital processing. These cameras will replace the current cameras that have reached there end of lifecycle. The purchase of 44 Motorola remote mount mobile radios containing multiple talk group capabilities, multi-key encryption capabilities, multiple system capabilities and interfaces to DVRS. These radios will be required for incoming pumpers and ambulances plus reserve apparatus used daily in our current system. These will replace obsolete and discontinued model acquired in 2010 in which support ended in 2016. 55 Motorola control stations with compatible trunking system containing multiple talk group capabilities, encryption capabilities, desk mic, and multiple audio outputs for multiple speaker systems. These control stations are located in all fire stations, battalion chief offices, and fixed facilities (e.g., headquarters, logistics center, fire academy) and will replace current obsolete and discontinued Harris M7100 control stations that were purchased in 1999 in which support ended in 2012. 15 Motrola remote mount mobile radios containing multiple talk group capabilities, multi-key encryption capabilities, multiple system capabilities, and includes all programming and installation. The radios will be installed with handheld control head or a standard control head depending on assignment. Required for 15 field battalion chief and EMS field supervisor vehicles, replacing obsolete and discontinued model with limited functionality purchased in 2010 in which support ended in 2016.
