Executive Summary

Appropriating the sum of \$10,000,000.00 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance of the Convention and Sports Complex Fund for the purpose of funding the City's contribution to the South Loop Link Project ("Project"); authorizing the City Manager to execute a Funding Agreement with the Downtown Council; and designating requisitioning authority.

Discussion

This legislation will authorize the contribution of \$10 million from the City to match Federal and State contributions of \$28.6 million each for the South Loop Link Project, and authorize the City Manager to execute a Funding Agreement with the Downtown Council.

The Southloop Link Project anticipates creation of an urban park over Interstate 670 on the south side of the downtown loop to be funded from a variety of public and private sources including a proposed contribution from the City of \$10 million based upon the food and beverage portion of the convention and tourism tax is expected to generate net revenue of \$26.9 million in FY2023-24.
