Executive Summary

Accepting and approving a \$20,200.00 grant award from the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services to provide funding for the Summer Food Services Program for Children; and designating requisitioning authority.

Discussion

Approximately 150 facilities provide summer food service in the City of Kansas City to care for children during daytime and nighttime operations. The State contracts with the Health Department to conduct inspections of these facilities to assure that the children are provided food prepared in facilities that meet safety and sanitation standards. Inspections focus on disease prevention; safe food handling; safe storage of toxic agents, cleaners and medicines; pest control; safe water supplies; basic evaluation and other environmental hazards in all summer food service operations.
