Making today, March 7, 2024, Terry Riley Day: A Servant Leader with a Heart for the City.

WHEREAS, Terry M. Riley is a Kanas City native, graduate of Southeast High School and attended Southeast Missouri State University in Cape Girardeau, Missouri; and
