Violence in Kansas City



One of the greatest threats facing Kansas City, Missouri (KCMO) is the spreading of violence, particularly gun-violence.

- Homicide is the leading cause of death for persons aged 15-40 in KCMO.
- Over the last 20 years, approximately 20-25% of all KCMO homicides have occurred in three neighborhoods (Santa Fe, Oak Park and East 23rd Street PAC) which comprises 1.3% of the city or 4.16 square miles.
- 2023 was Kansas City's deadliest year with 181 homicides.







Truancy Court
