Authorizing Lease Agreement #6223050079 for Office/Warehouse Space at the MCI Air Cargo Center 1 Facility located at Kansas City International Airport from September 1, 2023 to August 31, 2026, with the option to renew for one (1) additional two-year period.

The original Lease term began July 13, 2018 and ended June 30, 2023, it is currently in a Holdover period. WFS, a member of the SATS Group (Singapore Airport Terminal Services), is a global air cargo logistics leader and best in class ground handling partner. In addition to contracts with DHL and UPS, WFS provides ground handling services for Ford, General Motors, and many other automotive suppliers.

Beginning September 1, 2023 Worldwide Flight Services will pay the annual rental rate of \$322,342.44.



Executive Summary

Authorizing a \$5,267,529.00 design professional services contract with Burns & McDonnell Engineering Company, Inc., for the Water Master Plan and Risk Based Asset Management Plan Update project.

Discussion

Project Justification

The City completed a comprehensive Water Master Plan in 2014. While several of the improvements identified in the master plan have been implemented, several have been delayed because demands have not matched the projections developed in the master plan.

Like many utilities nationwide, KC Water has seen reduced customer demands over the past 10 years. As such, a detailed review of demand usage and projections is necessary to help identify timing for capital improvements and the identification of additional improvements.

Additionally, the City has developed a Digital Twin hydraulic model. As part of this master plan update, the Digital Twin and master planning hydraulic models will be updated and used to develop operational scenarios to be used by the City for future evaluations on the system.

For this project, the design professional shall review risk criteria developed for the Water Main Replacement program and evaluate potential software products to use for the program. Currently the City uses Info Asset Planner. The City also requires condition assessment on the pump stations throughout the distribution system.

Project Description

Services provided under this contract will include a review of the previous master plan, a comprehensive update to the master plan, update to the distribution system hydraulic model, review and recommendations for an improved risk assessment of the Water Main Replacement Program, valve criticality assessment, condition assessment of water treatment and pumping facilities, and an updated Capital Improvement Plan.

The term of this project will be 730 calendar days.

Solicitation

This Project was advertised in accordance with the City's requirements. Proposals were received on November 17, 2022 with two consultants responding.

Awardee/Subcontracting Participation

Burns & McDonnell Engineering Company, Inc. was selected for this project with a contract amount of \$5,267,529.00, with subcontracting participation of 14% MBE and 14% WBE.



WHEREAS, Section 68-475, Code of Ordinances, approved by voters in 2009 renewed the sales tax for transportation purposes through March 31, 2024; and

improving a public mass transportation system is hereby continued upon all sellers for the privilege of engaging in the business of selling tangible personal property or rendering taxable services at retail to the extent and in the manner provided in RSMo. §§ 144.010 through 144.525, and the rules and regulations of the director of revenue issued pursuant thereto. The rate of the tax shall be 3/8 percent on the receipts from the sale at retail of all tangible personal property or taxable services at retail within the city, if such property and such services are subject to taxation by the state under the provisions of RSMo. §§ 144.010 through 144.525. The tax shall become effective April 1, 2024, and shall apply to all sales made after March 31, 2024, until March 31, 2034, for a period of ten (10) years and shall be collected as provided in RSMo. §§ 94.600 through 94.655.

Section 2. **Election Called**. That an election is called to be held on Tuesday, August 8, 2023, at which election the question described in this ordinance shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the City for their consideration.
