Gunter Construction Company submitted the lowest and best bid.

Grant/Loan Funding

Human Relations Approval

The goals for the Design Professional Services Contract No. 1505 were approved by the Human Relations Department at 15% MBE and 10% WBE and remain unchanged for the proposed amendment.

The goals for the construction contract were established by the Fairness in Construction Board at 12% MBE and 12% WBE. Construction Subcontracting information was submitted to the Human Relations Department for review and determination on January 20, 2022, and was approved on January 21, 2022 with 14% MBE and 14% WBE participation.
