Authorizing the Director, Chief Engineering Officer, and Utility Asset Manager of the Water Services Department to act as the City's designated authorized representatives for participation by the City through its Water Services Department in the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) in accordance with federal requirements administered by the U.S. Department of the Treasury and state requirements administered by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources.

WHEREAS, Kansas City, Missouri intends to file an application with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources, Financial Assistance Center's State ARPA Grant Programs for a subaward of federal financial assistance provided to the State of Missouri by the U.S. Department of the Treasury ("Treasury") pursuant to Section 602(b) of the Social Security Act, as added by Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act, (Pub. L. No. 117-2 (March 11, 2021), 135 Stat. 4, 223-26 ("Act"); and

WHEREAS under the terms of section 602(c) of the Act and Treasury's regulations, the State of Missouri has authorized the making of grants to authorized applicants to aid in the completion of specific public projects related to lead service line inventory, drinking water, wastewater, and/or stormwater; and

WHEREAS, the Missouri Department of Natural Resources has requested that the City designate individuals authorized to execute documents on behalf of Kansas City, Missouri; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That, on behalf of the City, the Director, Chief Engineering Officer, and Utility Asset Manager of the Water Services Department are hereby authorized to furnish such information as the Missouri Department of Natural Resources may reasonably request in connection with the application to sign all necessary documents on behalf of the applicant, to furnish such assurances to the Missouri Department of Natural Resources as may be required by law or regulation, and to receive payment on behalf of the applicant.

Reducing appropriations in the General Fund Continger amount to the Land Bank Fund; appropriating \$300,000 to allow for additional funding for mowing and abateme date.

What is the reason for this legislation?

To provide an increase to mowing contractors to cover the increased costs fuel and to allow them to pay their staff \$15/hour.

Discussion (including relationship to other Counci actions)

The mowing contractors need to increase the pay of their mowers to retain and attract staff. The City has a minimum pay requirement of \$15/hour and the contractors should be able to pay their staff the same. Also, the price of gasoline has significantly increased. This increase to the mowing contractors would cover th increase of fuel and allow the contractors to pay their staff a fair wage.

Authorizing the City Manager to execute a Memorandum of Understanding with the Board of Police Commissioners of Kansas City, Missouri to provide off-street parking to the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department at City parking facilities commonly known as the JE Dunn Garage and Ed Wolf Garage for a term of ten years; and authorizing one additional five-year renewal.

WHEREAS, currently the City has an estimated 800 parking space vacancies in the Ed Wolf Garage on a daily basis; and

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the City Manager is authorized to execute a Memorandum of Understanding with the Board of Police Commissioners of Kansas City, Missouri to provide offstreet parking to the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department at facilities commonly known as the JE Dunn Garage and Ed Wolf Garage for a term of ten years with one additional five-year renewal. A copy of the Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") in substantial form is on file in the City Manager's Office.

Section 2. That the City Manager shall annually determine the supply and demand of the city owned Ed Wolf Garage.

Section 3. That a condition to this MOU is that if the City stops providing city employees with free parking in the JE Dunn Garage and Ed Wolf Garage then this MOU providing free off street parking to police department civilian employees will be immediately terminated upon thirty (30) days notice from the City to the Board of Police Commissioners of Kansas City, Missouri.

WHEREAS, Section 3-41(a)(2), Code of Ordinances, requires the Manager of Procurement Services, to obtain City Council authorization to enter into contracts that may exceed \$1,000,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the contract for security services will exceed \$5,000,000.00 for each fiscal year and subsequent years; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the Manager of Procurement Services is authorized to execute a one-year term and supply contract (EV2218) with United American Security, LLC, d/b/a GardaWorld Security Services that exceeds the \$1,000,000.00 Section 3-41(a)(2) threshold to provide security services with such funds that are appropriated in the City Budget. Copies of the Contract are on file in the Procurement Services Division.

Section 2. That the Manager of Procurement Services is authorized to execute contract amendments and is authorized to exercise the City's five one-year renewal options without additional Council authorization.

WHEREAS, on or about June 15, 2020, the City of Kansas City, Missouri ("City"), through its Water Services Department ("KC Water"), entered into a Cooperative Agreement ("Agreement") with Bridging the Gap, Inc. in the amount of \$183,000.00, with renewal options, to fund the Leak Stoppers Program which is designed to fix home water leaks in the City's low-income, urban core neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement was renewed in June 2021 in the amount of \$183,000.00; and

WHEREAS, KC Water and Bridging the Gap, Inc. desire to renew this contract for a second time bringing the total expended over \$400,000.00; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the Director of Water Services Department is authorized to execute Contract No. 20003-2 in the amount of \$183,000.00 with Bridging the Gap, Inc. for the Leak Stoppers Program, Renewal No. 2. A copy of the contract is on file in the office of the Director of Water Services.

Section 2. That the Director of the Water Services Department is authorized to expend up to the sum of \$183,000.00 from Account No. 23-8010-801100-619880, Consumer Services, to satisfy the cost of this contract.

Details

Reason for Legislation

This proposed ordinance authorizes a \$183,000.00 Renewal No. 2 to the Leak Stoppers Program Cooperative Agreement with Bridging the Gap, Inc., a Missouri Non-Profit company.

Discussion

The Leak Stopper Program consists of the Non-Profit coordinating with KC Water to promote water conservation and fix home water leaks in Kansas City's low-income, urban-core neighborhoods. The Non-Profit is to provide the necessary management and administration services for this program.

The City executed the Leak Stoppers Program Cooperative Agreement on April 3, 2020 for \$183,000.00. A no-cost Amendment No. 1 was executed on April 14, 2021 to extend the term of the Agreement and move remaining funding from the Toilet Replacement component to the Water Conservation Kit and Complex Leak Repair components.

The City executed Renewal No. 1 to the Leak Stoppers Program Cooperative Agreement on June 15, 2021 for \$183,000.00. The City will be executing a no-cost Amendment No. 1 to Renewal No. 1 in order to extend the term for an additional 30 days so that the Agreement does not expire.

This proposed ordinance authorizes a \$183,000.00 Renewal No. 2 to the Leak Stoppers Program Cooperative Agreement. An ordinance is required for City Council to authorize this Renewal No. 2 as the accumulative total of all the Agreements will exceed the \$400,000.00, City Council threshold for Cooperative Agreements.
