RESOLUTION - Declaring May 2023, as Older Americans Month in Kansas City, Missouri.

WHEREAS, Kansas City, Missouri includes a growing number of older Americans who contribute their time, wisdom, and experience to our community; and

WHEREAS, Kansas City, Missouri benefits when people of all ages, abilities, and backgrounds have the opportunity to participate and live independently; and

WHEREAS, Kansas City, Missouri recognizes our need to create a community that offers the services and support to older adults who may need to make choices about how they age; and

WHEREAS, Kansas City, Missouri can work to build an even better community for our older residents by:

- Not limiting our thinking about aging,
- Exploring and combating stereotypes and emphasizing the many positive aspects of aging,
- Inspiring older adults to push past traditional boundaries, and
- Embracing our community’s diversity;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

That the Mayor and Council hereby declare May 2023, as Older Americans Month in Kansas City, Missouri; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution be spread upon the Minutes of the Council in testimony thereof and that a copy hereof be presented to Tina Uridge, Executive Director, Clay County Senior Services, Melody Elston, MSW, Interim Director, Aging & Adult Services, Mid-America Regional Council and Debra L.
